Monterey trip - July 27-29, 2023

In the early 1990's, the Carmichael Golf Club (CGC) dabbled in the idea of an 'away golf trip' – to play some different courses, and to get out of the Sacramento area for awhile during the heat of the Summer. Our first trial balloons were 2 day trips up to Forest Meadows, a short 18 hole course in the Foothills.

Even then, Monterey was the ultimate destination trip – travel far enough that it was a true getaway, golf courses far different than what we played in Sacramento, with a very good chance of getting a reprieve from the Summer heat. Our first CGC Monterey trip was in 1996. Our return in 2023 marked the CGC's 10^{th} visit to Monterey.

Monterey golf can be a balancing act between course difficulty and cost. Cost wise, everything cascades down from Pebble Beach – which currently would likely cost you \$600 to play. Realistically, that probably means that every other course in the area is over priced. So the trick when scheduling a Monterey trip is to try and find value, enjoyment – and some challenge, without intentionally beating anyone up (from a golfing perspective).

For 2023, that meant a 3^{rd} CGC visit to Del Monte, a first time CGC visit to Monterey Pines, and an 'away trip' record 8^{th} CGC visit to Pacific Grove. We definitely got the best of Monterey weather – temperatures in the low to mid 60's, with sun breaking through earlier at Del Monte and Monterey Pines than at Pacific Grove for our final round!
